Poster Format and Instructions (Recommended and Thanks to ATCM 2004-Singapore LOC Team)

During the poster presentations you are expected to further explain your work orally to any interested parties. The schedule for poster presentation will be announced in the Conference Program.

Double-sided adhesive tapes and pins will be available at the Secretariat for you to put up your posters on the display panels.

Poster Size: The poster should be around 80cm wide and 130cm high. Presenters should use a font of at least 24 points so as to make the posters readable at a distance of 1.5m. Poster presenters should consider using both textual and visual means of presentation in their posters.

Your poster must include the following:

- Poster title
- Author(s)
- Affiliation or organization

Sections: You may wish to consider the following sections when designing your poster:

| Problem definitions & objectives | Make clear which problem you have studied and the aims of your work. |
|----------------------------------|--|
| Strategy, methods, theory | Indicate how you have tried to solve the set problem. Emphasize novel theoretical and experimental approaches. |
| Results | Present your findings to justify the conclusions. Make use of tables and graphs. |
| Conclusions | Draw conclusions about what you have learned from your work. Indicate the significance of the conclusions. |
| References | Give up to 3 key references to position your work. |

Additional Notes:

- the poster should be self-explanatory with clear objectives and conclusions
- each section should be clearly marked with a section heading
- use bullets to state your points instead of full sentences whenever possible
- all tables and graphs should have a caption
- axes of graphs should be clearly labeled
